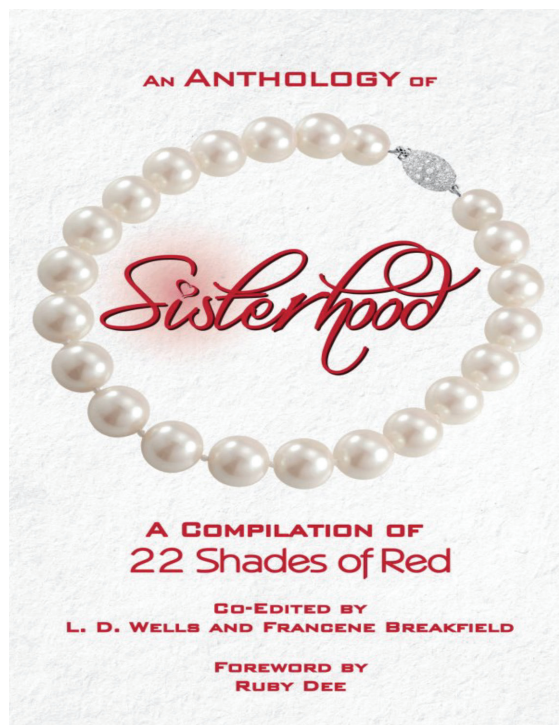


AN ANTHOLOGY OF SISTERHOOD RUBY DEE LEGACY OF SISTERHOOD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Ruby Dee Legacy of Sisterhood Scholarship is made possible by a generous donation to the Delta Research and Educational Foundation (DREF) contributed by Dr. Francene Breakfield and L. DREF is proud to announce the availability of the 2020 Ruby Dee Sisterhood Scholarship. The scholarship is administered by DREF. Scholarships will be awarded to a current college student who best meets the requirements set forth by the benefactors along with the Ruby Dee and Ossie Davis family.

The \$1,000 merit-based scholarship will be awarded annually to a deserving African American female student who is either a junior or senior collegiate or a graduate student majoring in English, Literature, Drama, Art, Music, African American Studies, Communications, Education, Fine Arts, Performing Arts, or Visual Arts. The Scholarship Selection Committee will review and rate all applications submitted. Applicant's references may be contacted by telephone. The Scholarship Selection Committee may also choose to interview final candidates. The scholarship recipient will be notified by July 1, 2020.

Applicants must meet the following guidelines:

1. Currently attend an accredited college or university on a full time basis.
2. Be a female enrolled as a junior, senior or a graduate student.
3. Must have a Grade Point Average (GPS) of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.
4. Must be actively pursuing a Humanities degree at the undergraduate or graduate level.
5. Demonstrated community service and leadership skills – which is clearly reflected in recommendation letters.
6. Applicant must have permanent residency (home address) in a state that is part of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's Southern Region or Eastern Region. Preference will be given to applicants from Georgia and New York.
7. The applicant should note any special financial needs on their application form.

All applications and supporting documents must be received by May 1, 2020.

Please advise your college registrar of this deadline for submission of transcripts and other supporting documentation.

1. All questions must be answered. Incomplete applications will be disqualified. Please use N/A to indicate inability to answer. Leave no blanks.
2. Applications must be typewritten or identically reproduced in computer form. All handwritten applications will be disqualified. 3. Attach additional sheets as needed in order to complete the application.
4. Applications must include the following:
 - Complete application form, including essay
 - Three references with complete contact information for each (on application form)
 - A copy of your most recent college transcript (may be sent separately)
5. **Applications must be received by May 1, 2020. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS. Student must submit the completed application form and all requested documents via email to info@deltafoundation.net**
6. Successful applicants will be notified on or before **July 1, 2020**. Interviews may be necessary.

Note: Scholarships are awarded to successful candidates and are at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee and will be transferred to the recipient's school account the following Fall Semester.
