Thank you for participating in the 5K Centennial Walk and Health Fair

Thank you to the more than 1,000 persons who registered for the 5K Centennial Walk and Health Fair presented by The Delta Foundation on Friday, July 12, 2013 as a pre-convention activity of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's 51st National Convention. Registered walkers donated \$19.13 to participate in the 5K walk, with proceeds benefitting the charitable and educational programs

of the Foundation. The donation amount symbolized the founding year of the Sorority, 1913, as convention attendees commemorate the 100th anniversary of DST in the Nation's Capital, July 11-18, 2013.



Vivian Ware Fellow Completes Impact Study

A study on the impact of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's educational development programs on African American youth has been completed by Dr. Kidogo A. Kennedy, the

2012-13 Vivian A. Ware Research Fellow. During the past fiscal year, Dr. Kennedy conducted research on the perceived influence of the Sorority's educational programming on African American youth. The Ware Fellow's impact study examines the personal development and academic achievement of youth involved in Delta programs during a 25 year-period (1987-2012).

The findings of the Impact Study are featured on the Foundation's website (www. deltafoundation.net) . In August 2013, two webinar sessions will be held to review the findings with Delta chapters members who work with their local educational development committee. Special Giving Opportunities

For Delta, Forever

During the past fiscal year, The Delta Foundation launched a special giving campaign, "For Delta, Forever," where Delta members were asked to make a substantial contribution to position the Foundation to expand its services in Delta's second century of service. Delta members have supported this campaign in two Giving Circles: 100 Deltas giving \$1,000 and 1000 Deltas giving \$100. To date, \$33,000 has been pledged for this campaign, with over half of the funds collected. Delta sorors contributing \$1,000 were recognized at a private reception on July 11, 2013. The recognition reception was sponsored by Ernst & Young.

PPD Centennial Fund

A Centennial Program Planning and Development Fund was established at The Delta Foundation during the past fiscal year to raise funds to expand the Community Empowerment Grantmaking Program. Delta chapters and individual members responded enthusiastically, contributing the requested amount of \$20.13. As of press time, donations totaled \$54,375.

CPTF Violet Campaign

In honor of Mother's Day, the Sorority's National Charitable Partnerships Task Force (CPTF) named The Delta Foundation as one of its recipients for the Project 13 Violet Giving Campaign. Project 13 is an initiative established by CPTF for Delta members to commit to donating to 13 charities during the centennial year. As of June 2013, the Foundation received \$4,006 in unrestricted donations.
