Lois Elizabeth Bingham, Esq. serves as Executive Director of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Before joining Delta, she worked as a business attorney for more than 25 years representing for-profit and non-profit companies around the world. Most recently, she served eight years as Vice President, General Counsel, Secretary and Compliance Officer of a major Japanese automotive supplier and its 70,000 employees located within North and Central America. A native of Detroit, Michigan, she earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Pennsylvania and her Juris Doctorate Degree from Temple University School of Law.

Ms. Bingham is the Immediate Past President of the Detroit Alumnae Chapter. In addition to her years of service within the Detroit Alumnae Chapter, Ms. Bingham is a member of several bar associations and has served on the Board of Directors of many community organizations, such as The Black United Fund of Michigan, Just the Beginning - A Pipeline Organization based in Chicago, and Legal Aid and Defenders Association of Michigan, where she served as Board Chair. Currently, Ms. Bingham is an Independent Director on the Board of Directors of USA Gymnastics and serves on the Board of Advisors for the Baltimore, MD based Vehicles for Change affiliate organization in Detroit.

Recognized for her leadership, Ms. Bingham was the first African-American to be promoted to Vice President in the 100+ year history of a global automotive information services company headquartered in Michigan and was the first African-American woman elected to serve as Chair of the State Bar of Michigan's International Law Section.
